Amendment for Purposes of Delisting Properties From The National Register of Historic Places

In 1984, the Mississippi Department of Archives and History filed a nomination of numerous properties located in the Biloxi Multiple Resource Area, Harrison County, Mississippi. Since the date of listing, the following properties have lost the qualities which originally caused it to be listed. Each property was destroyed on or about August 29, 2005 by Hurricane Katrina and should be delisted from the National Register of Historic Places. Biloxi's Tivoli Hotel was severely damaged by the hurricane and demolished in May 2006.

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: Biloxi's Tivoli Hotel is a six-story, T-shaped, brick building oriented toward the Gulf of Mexico. Encircling the T's longitudinal component is a one-story, U-shaped section which houses the restaurant, dining rooms, and other public areas. An impressive arcade of tall, round-arched openings with molded stone archivolts, keystones, and medillions in the spandrels comprise the facade of the single-story section and carries a brick parapet which is punctuated above the central three bays by a molded stone balustrade. Beyond the facade, the only additional exterior ornament of note is found along the top story, which is set apart from the lower floors by a molded stone belt course. Stone quoins mark the corners of the building, while finely detailed stone surrounds with keystones ornament each window opening. A brick parapet with enriched stone panels and balustrades highlights the roof of the main structure. The double-leaf main entrance, framed by sidelights and surmounted by an oversized transom and full entablature, opens into a small vaulted vestibule which gives access to the richly decorated main lobby. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE:

Among the least altered of Biloxi's early-twentieth-century grand hotels, Biloxi's Tivoli Hotel is the best example of Second Renaissance Revival design on the Mississippi Gulf Coast and boasts a high degree of interior and exterior integrity. For many years it was regarded as one of the Gulf Coast's finest resort hotels and claimed to be "the only apartment hotel in the vicinity" (Julia Guice, editor, The Buildings of Biloxi: An Architectural Survey [Biloxi: City of Biloxi, 1976], p. 66).

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: Corinthian pilasters support a full entablature which, in turn, supports the barrel-vaulted lobby ceiling. A balcony with an elaborate metal balustrade faces the entrance across the lobby. Baseboards are of marble, and walls are scored to resemble ashlar masonry. The ballroom and other public rooms have fine Adamesque detailing.
