

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

RE: Establishment of Historic Preservation District

The public are requested to take notice that the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Port Gibson, pursuant to Section 39-13-3 Miss. Code Annot. (1972), as amended, shall on Monday, April 12, 1993, at 5:00 o'clock p.m. at City Hall in Port Gibson, Mississippi hold a public hearing on the issue of whether or not this Mayor and Board of Aldermen should enact an ordinance providing for the establishment and location of the hereinafter shown historic preservation district within the City of Port Gibson:

Start at the point where the northern boundary line of the City of Port Gibson intersects the center line of U. S. Hwy. 61, point of beginning. From said point of beginning follow the boundary line of the City of Port Gibson in a westerly direction to the northern most corner of Parcel No. 46 as shown on Map 67-F of the Tax Maps of the City of Port Gibson, Mississippi on file in the office of the City Clerk. Run thence in a southwesterly direction along the northwestern line of said Parcel No. 46, 300 feet, more or less, to a point where said line (extended) intersects the southern right of way of Anthony Street. Run thence in a westerly or northwesterly direction along the south right of way of Anthony Street approximately 250 feet to the northwestern corner of Parcel No. 48 as shown on said Map 67-F (the Oil Mill property). Run thence in a southwesterly direction 70 feet, more or less, along the northwestern boundary of said Parcel No. 48 to the municipal boundary of the City of Port Gibson. Run thence beginning in a southerly direction and then in the varying directions thereof and following the municipal boundary of the City of Port Gibson, Mississippi to a point which is 150 feet west of the western right of way line of Woodstock Street (extended). Run thence in a northerly direction parallel to the western right of way line of Woodstock Street and 150 feet west of the western right of way thereof to a point which is 450 feet south of the south right of way line of McComb Avenue (Miss. Hwy. 547). Run thence in an easterly direction parallel to the

southern right of way line of said McComb Avenue and 450 feet south therefrom to the point where this line intersects with the center line of Bridewell Lane. Run thence in a northerly direction along the center line of Bridewell Lane to a branch which point is also a corner of the large tract of land in the northeastern part of the City of Port Gibson which is zoned agricultural (commonly known as Jordan's Bottom) as per the zoning map of the City of Port Gibson on file with the City Clerk. Run thence along the southwestern boundary of said agricultural district in the varying directions thereof to a point which is 150 feet in an easterly direction from the eastern right of way line of Vine Street. Run thence in a northerly direction parallel to Vine Street and 150 feet easterly of the eastern most right of way thereof to a point which is 100 feet north of the northern boundary of Orange Street (extended). Run thence in a westerly direction parallel with Orange Street and 100 feet north of the northern right of way line thereof to a point which is 165 feet east of the eastern boundary line of U. S. Hwy. 61. Run thence northward parallel to U. S. Hwy. 61 and 165 feet east of the eastern right of way line thereof to the northern corporate boundary line of the City of Port Gibson, Mississippi. Run thence in a westerly direction along the corporate boundary line of the City of Port Gibson to the point of beginning.

NOTE: (1) All land is zoned agricultural as per the zoning map of the City of Port Gibson on file with the City Clerk and lying east of U. S. Hwy. 61 is excluded from the historical district, except for the property described hereinabove which fronts on Orange and Vine Streets. (2) All land zoned industrial as per said City zoning map and which lies east of Bridewell Lane is excluded from the historical district.


The aforesaid property is the same that is shown within the heavier dotted line on the map below.

The public is further hereby notified that all property located within an historic preservation district so designated and established by ordinance of this Mayor and Board of Aldermen shall be under the jurisdiction and control of the Port Gibson Preservation Commission and the

Port Gibson Preservation Ordinance which was passed on March 2, 1992 and recorded in Book 3 at pages 72-92 of the Ordinance Book of the City of Port Gibson, Mississippi, and which said Ordinance may be inspected in the office of the City Clerk at City Hall. The master map of the proposed historical district may also be inspected in the office of the City Clerk at City Hall. If you have any question whether or not certain property is located within the proposed historical preservation district please advise the City Clerk and a determination will be provided to you.
