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#### AMENDMENT

Woodville Historic District (Boundary Increase) Woodville, Wilkinson County, Mississippi

The purpose of this amendment is to increase the boundaries of the Woodville Historic District National Register nomination (listed September 30, 1982) to include the Old Yazoo & Mississippi Valley Railroad Station. The purpose of this amendment is not to update the Woodville Historic District nomination, but to merely add one contributing and one noncontributing building. There have been changes to the district since it was listed, but these changes are not documented here. The documentation submitted herein pertains only to the added properties.

Item 2: Location 546 Depot Street and 559 Third South Street Woodville, Wilkinson County (code 157), Mississippi (code MS), 39669

Description:

The Woodville Historic District was originally nominated to the National Register in 1982. As stated in the original nomination, the district is a distinctive collection of buildings representing a variety of historic architectural styles roughly dating from the period 1820-1930. Governmental, commercial, religious and residential buildings are included in the district. This boundary increase is being made to add to the district one architecturally-significant railroad station that dates to the period of significance.

- 128. C 546 Depot Street. Old Yazoo & Mississippi Valley Railroad Station. This one-story, frame building is crowned by a gabled roof having widely overhanging eaves. A three-foot wide band of vertical beaded board is below the fascia and extends across each elevation. The eave-oriented northeast elevation has six bays: a single-leaf, panelled and glazed door with transom flanked by one-over-one, double-hung windows, and three beaded board freight doors topped by four-light transoms. The freight doors open onto a loading dock that wraps around the southeast elevation, which has a single beaded board freight door. The northwest elevation features a wainscot of vertical beaded board and four oneover-one, double-hung windows, and a gabled boxed bay highlights the southwest elevation. Circa 1911.
- 129. NC 559 Third South Street. Plitt House. Built in 1939, this one-story, frame house has a brick foundation and sidegabled roof with intersecting gables. There are exposed rafter tails in the eaves and purlins in the gables. The main facade has four bays: a pair of six-over-six, doublehung windows; a segmental-arched doorway set within a projecting gabled bay; a secondary single-leaf doorway; and a pair of six-light casement windows. A brick deck spans three of the bays, two of which are protected by a metal awning supported by metal posts. A large rear addition was made to the house in 1974.

#### Item 8: Statement of Significance

The Woodville Historic District is locally significant under Criterion C because it is an important concentration of buildings of architectural distinction constructed between 1820 and 1930. The Old Y&MV Railroad Station, built circa 1911, is contemporary with a number of the other buildings in the district and contributes to the architectural character of the district. It is significant as a relatively intact small town railroad depot of the turn of the century. The depot is a typical example of the stations that were built in small towns across the country at the turn of the century, comprising a one-story, frame building with a roof having widely overhanging eaves, and a projecting bay on the track-side elevation that was used by the agent to enable him to see the train movements. The Plitt House, although more than 50 years old, is a noncontributing element because it was constructed after the period of significance. It is not known why the district boundaries were

not originally extended to include the railroad station; perhaps because the building was vacant at the time.

The Woodville Civic Club hopes to acquire and restore the Old Y&MV Railroad Station as an adjunct to the Wilkinson County Museum.


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
