Amendment for Purposes of Delisting Properties From The National Register of Historic Places

In 1984, the Mississippi Department of Archives and History filed a nomination of numerous properties located in the Biloxi Multiple Resource Area, Harrison County, Mississippi. Since the date of listing, the following properties have lost the qualities which originally caused it to be listed. Each property was destroyed on or about August 29, 2005 by Hurricane Katrina and should be delisted from the National Register of Historic Places. Biloxi's Tivoli Hotel was severely damaged by the hurricane and demolished in May 2006.

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: The Bailey House is a large, two-story, hip-roof, frame residence distinguished by a two-tiered undercut gallery with un-embellished square columns which extend across the six-bay facade and along the east elevation. The entrance, framed by a transom and sidelights, is in a vernacular Greek Revival mode with simple pilasters supporting a full entablature with a slightly projecting cornice. An exterior stair, located on the east elevation, gives access to the upper gallery which is guarded by a simple balustrade with rectangular-sectioned balusters. The building's central hall plan varies from the norm by being two-and-a-half-rooms deep and having a stairhall which runs along the north end perpendicular to the central hall.

ALTERATIONS: Single-story addition to west elevation. The three westerly bays of the facade's lower gallery have been enclosed.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE: The Bailey House is the oldest extant building in "The Point" area of Biloxi and the last remnant of a prosperous mid-nineteenth-century area known as the Summerville Addition. It is the only one of Biloxi's early two-story residences to feature a gallery on the south and east sides only. Built for Nathan Evans Barley, a New Orleans vinegar manufacturer, the house was used as a mission for the workers in the Point Cadet area by the Methodist Episcopal Church from 1913 to 1942.


