HITECTURAL DESCRIPTION:	NAME: Temple Theater
<pre>donumental brick construction; four stories occupying one-half block. Front facade divided into three sections: a projecting central pavilion with a giant horseshoe-arch entrance supported on fluted columns, scalloped cor- nice, and slightly pedimented parapet; and two corner pavilions having recessed flat-arch entrances framed by freestanding columns and elongated norseshoe-arch fenestration above, which rise through 2 floors. There is a profuse linear and sculptural terra-cotta decoration on the two street facades (south and west). The Temple Theater was erected in 1924 by the Hamasa Shriners, but because if a shortage of funds the auditorium was unfinished until the building was leased by the Saenger movie chain in 1927, which completed the interior t a cost of \$135,000. In addition to movies( "photo-plays"), the Saenger emple Theatre also had comedies, news weeklies, reviews, scenics and ovelties, including travelling vaudevilles. At its opening dedication t was called "Mississippi's finest theater" and Meridian became "one of he headlines of progressive large cities in the field of entertainment" although the city already held this position due to the Grand Opera ouse). The original seating capacity has decreased from 1760 to 1634. he stage was reportedly larger than any in the U.S., with the exception f the Roxy in New York, at the time the theater was completed.
