RCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION:

Three-story, three-bay stone construction with rusticated ashlar finish; built into the side of a hill so that northern facade is only two stories with basement. Central projecting section has two-story recessed entrance supported by columns with lotus flower capitals; a vulture and sundisk symbol in the entablature directly above the columns. Pilasters between front- and side-facade windows are decorated with polychromatic terracotta, as are sphinxes on stoops at the corners of front staircase. The cornice is of the Egyptian gorge-and-roll type. There are also obelisks on the entrance stoops.

ATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE:

The design of the Scottish Rite Temple was based on an original sketch and later plans by Hyman W. Witcover, Grand Secretary General of the Supreme Council, and an architect by profession, of Savannah. The inspiration for this design came when Witcover visited Egypt and was impressed by the Temple to Osiris on the Island of Philae. This island and temple are now submerged due to the construction of the Aswan Dam. Witcover designed a Scottish Rite Temple with the hope it would one day be constructed by one of the Scottish Rite Bodies, and in 1914 the plans were accepted by Mississippi Consistory No. 1. P. J. Krouse, Meridian's notable architect and a Scottish Rite member, designed the actual plans and supervised construction. Cass Construction Company of Georgia was the contractor.
