

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

There is little evidence regarding the age or cultural affiliation of the Berry Mound and village site, which was recorded for the first time by the Mississippi Archaeological Survey team in 1969. Surface material collected from the area around the mound consists of several dozen spalls, seven small sherds, and two projectile points. The sherds, all of which were eroded, are similar to the Baytown types of the Late Woodland period. One of the projectile points is a slightly barbed, contracting stem dart point, while the other is a small side-notched arrow point, closely resembling the Sequoyah point.

The fact that the Berry Mound is relatively undamaged, but in the vicinity of a rapidly expanding metropolitan area, makes it imperative that it be preserved for possible future investigation.
