

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Dupree Mound has been virtually destroyed by unauthorized digging. Measurements of the mound in 1926 indicated that it was sixty feet in diameter and twelve feet in height. Its present height is approximately six feet, and the diameter of the mound is variable. The portion of the mound remaining is covered with tall grass, bushes and trees.

The mound was surrounded by a village site which is currently being used as pasture land. Originally, the mound was conical shaped.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Dupree site was excavated in 1927 and 1928 by Moreau B. Chambers and James A. Ford for the Mississippi Department of Archives and History. The mound was a late burial mound, containing early Mississippian material. Thirty-five burials were found.

The Dupree site is especially significant since it serves as a source for some of the key Plaquemine culture pottery types.

The records of Chambers and Ford would allow an accurate reconstruction of the mound.

this possibility may well merit investigation. Excavations of the surrounding village area could yield additional knowledge regarding the cultural affiliation of the Indians who resided on the site.


