DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Hester-Standifer Creek Site is approximately six acres in size and varies in thickness of deposit with much of it being as much as up to three feet in depth. It is divided by a small depression into two areas of more or less equal size. Tests in the depression yield little or no artifactual material and little midden deposit. The two areas yield virtually the same inventory of cultural material and are considered at present to represent one site. The depression seems to be modern and intrusive into the prehistoric midden. Two acres have seen substantial disturbance. The site overlies a stratum of gravel which is being mined throughout the area. Part of the midden has been destroyed in this operation, and unfortunately we will never know how much. Another part of the site, a roughly rectangular area of approximately one hundred twenty feet by one hundred feet, has been excavated by local collectors and thus is destroyed for all practical purposes. The surface of approximately half of the site is covered by small pine trees; the remaining half is an open field.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Hester-Standifer Creek Site is a large multi-component site covering approximately six acres. The midden deposit varies in depth but is over four feet in places. Much of the lower part of this deposit has not been affected by modern disturbance. Excavations indicate a fairly continuous and heavy occupation from the Late Paleo Indian period through the Early Archaic period. Earlier Paleo Indian period material is present in small amounts as is Later Archaic, Woodland, and Mississippian period material. Excavations by the Mississippi Department of Archives and History in 1973 and 1974 have revealed considerable information concerning the cultural sequence of the area during the earlier part of the site's history. One of the main activities carried out here throughout the duration of occupation was the manufacture of chipped stone tools. Nearby Sandifer Creek today contains an abundant supply of chert cobbles of sufficient size and quality for the requirements of the chipping industry. There are large quantities of tools in all stages of manufacture throughout the deposit, and it is possible because of this to determine the various stone working techniques used throughout the history of the site. There was also considerable tool use as evidenced by the large number of completed but broken or worn out implements. The wide variety of tools used indicates that a number of different activities were being carried out simultaneously. There are knives, saws, and scrapers which are suitable for butchering and skin processing of animals. Other tools suggest work on antler, bone, and wood. Adzes are a further indication of wood working industry. Pitted stones together with charred nut hulls are indicative of the processing of wild plant food.

The evidence seems to indicate that this site was used throughout the earlier years of its occupation as a base camp where the various activities of a total society were carried out. The size of Hester-Standifer Creek in relation to the other much smaller sites of that time period suggests that it was a major center at least for part of the annual cycle for perhaps three thousand years.
