Chunky River Bridge Chunky, Newton County, Mississippi

Narrative Description:

The Chunky River Bridge is located on a narrow road on the southern edge of the small town of Chunky in Newton County, about a third of a mile south of U.S. Highway 80.

Built in 1911, by the Nashville Bridge Company of Nashville, Tennessee, it is a one-lane, single-span Pratt through-truss bridge of steel construction, 100.6 feet in length and 14 feet in width, with a deck surfaced in wooden planking. It is approached at both the north and south ends by elevated roadways with wooden plank decking and low wooden railings.

The top chords of the structural truss consist of two channels and one plate connected underneath by small rectangular plates. The end posts are constructed in the same manner. The intermediate posts consist of two channels latticed together, and the hip verticals have two angles. The bottom chords consist of two rectilinear I-bars. The diagonal members consist of two rectilinear I-bars, and the counters consist of single rectilinear I-bars. The metal truss span is supported beneath by concrete-filled metal caissons.

Although not regularly maintained, it is in fairly good condition and has not been altered. It has, however, suffered from rust.

Narrative Statement of Significance:

The Chunky River Bridge, built in 1911, is locally significant under Criterion C in the area of Engineering, because it is one of the most intact surviving examples in Mississippi of a one-lane Pratt through truss bridge. Bridges of this type were commonly built on rural roads throughout Mississippi from around 1900 through the 1930s, but surviving examples are now becoming very rare.

A comprehensive survey of all known truss bridges in the state of Mississippi pre-dating 1953, conducted in 1986, revealed 35 surviving examples of the single-span Pratt through truss type, the oldest being the Tibbee Bridge in Clay County, built in 1896 (listed on the National Register in 1988). By the time these bridges were resurveyed in 2002, eleven had been demolished, and another six had been abandoned. The continued survival of many others is problematic.

The Chunky River Bridge is an intact surviving example of this increasingly rare type of bridge, and it is now the only surviving through truss vehicular bridge in Newton County. (There is also a Pratt through truss railroad bridge at Chunky, that crosses the Chunky River about a half mile to the northeast.)

Verbal Boundary Description

This structure is located in the northeast quarter of Section 35, Township 6 North, Range 13 East, in the town of Chunky, Newton County, Mississippi. It consists of a 14-foot by 100.6-foot truss bridge located at UTM coordinates 16-318160-3577490.

Boundary Justification:

The nominated property consists only of the steel truss bridge itself, which is significant as a representative example of its type of bridge construction.
