

Statement of significance:

This bridge consists of one Pratt pony truss span, a type of truss span commonly used in Mississippi during the early 20th century. This bridge is significant in that it embodies "the distinctive characteristics of a type, period or method of construction." It was preserved by a 1983 agreement between the Mississippi Department of Archives and History, the Clarke County Board of Supervisors, and the State Federal Aide [sic] Highway Department,
