Facing north onto Park Street in downtown Louisville, the Old Masonic Hall is a two-story, frame, side-gabled, Greek Revival building. The main facade is divided into five bays by monumental pilasters that support a full entablature. The lower level contains a central, double-leaf entrance of panelled and glazed doors topped by a seven-light transom, while the other four bays of this level and the five bays of the upper level contain nine-over-nine, double-hung windows. Added in 1965, the one-story, full-width porch features a brick deck at ground level with four brick steps leading to the entrance, Doric columns resting on brick pedestals, and a hip roof.

The east elevation is framed by monumental corner pilasters supporting a full entablature. The gable is pedimented, and the tympanum is clad in flushboard and contains a semi-circular ventilator with keystone. The three-bay wide elevation features a central double-leaf entrance with panelled and glazed doors crowned by a seven-light transom and protected by a gable roof supported by brackets. Window openings are nine-over-nine, double-hung windows.

The west elevation is framed by monumental corner pilasters supporting a full entablature. The lower story contains only one opening—a central, single—leaf wooden door protected by a flat awning. The upper story contains three nine—over—nine, double—hung windows. The rear (south) elevation, also framed by corner pilasters, has five nine—over—nine, double—hung windows on each level.

Originally the interior consisted of one large room on each floor, but partitions have been erected on the lower level to create office space. On the second floor, a partition has been added to the western end of the space to create a kitchen area.

A gazebo was constructed behind the building in recent years.

The Old Masonic Hall in Louisville is locally significant in the area of architecture (Criterion C), being a good example of the Greek Revival style. Although a comprehensive survey of Winston County has not yet been conducted, the Old Masonic Hall is one of the very few antebellum structures believed to be extant in the county and the only Greek Revival style building identified to date. In fact, only four antebellum buildings have been identified in the county thus far, and all four are believed to have been constructed by Samuel Washington Smyth. In addition, the Old Masonic Hall in Louisville is one of only four surviving, free-standing, antebellum Masonic Lodge Hall buildings that have been identified in Mississippi as of this date, and of these four, this building is the most architecturally elaborate. The other three are Palmer's Hall in Hesterville, Attala County (1851); Polar Star Lodge Hall in the Handsboro community, which is now part of Gulfport, Harrison County (c. 1852); and the Masonic Hall in Fayette, Jefferson County (1844).

In 1851 Louisville Lodge No. 75, F&AM, contracted with Samuel Washington Smyth to build the Masonic Hall. Smyth was born in South Carolina in 1809 and moved with his family to Winston County about 1838. The other extant buildings constructed by Smyth are all in Louisville and are discussed below:

- 1. The First Presbyterian Church was built in 1845 as a plain, square clapboard building with a square steeple. In 1920 the building was substantially remodelled in the Neoclassical Revival style, with alterations including the removal of the steeple, the addition of a portico, and the addition of a brick veneer. N.W. Overstreet was the architect in charge of the remodelling.
- 2. The Foster-Fair House is a "Carolina I-House" built between 1842 and 1852. It retains a good degree of integrity.
- 3. The Benjamin Franklin Smyth House, begun in 1840 as a single-pen log house with sleeping loft, was enlarged circa 1845 into a hall-and-parlor plan house, with clapboard siding and a full-length gallery added. Benjamin was Samuel Washington Smyth's brother, and it is believed that the two brothers collaborated on the original construction as well as enlargement of this house.

For the Masonic Hall, Smyth designed an austere two-story structure with simple Greek Revival detailing. The Old Masonic Hall exhibits such Greek Revival features as monumental pilasters delineating the bays of the main facade and the corners of each side elevation, a full entablature trimming the roof, and pedimented gables. Except for the addition of a full-width porch in 1965, the building retains a good degree of architectural integrity.

The upper story of the building was originally used for lodge meetings and the lower story housed the Masonic Female Institute, but was later rented to a teacher to conduct a regular school. The lower floor remained a school until about 1910, when a new school was built. The first story was then used as a community center, housing such events as concerts and plays. In 1922 the building was sold to the City of Louisville and since 1958 has housed the Louisville-Winston County Chamber of Commerce offices and serves as a meeting place for some clubs and organizations.



Verbal Boundary Description:


Commence at the Northeast corner of Block 6 of the Southwest Square according to the official plat of the Town of Louisville; thence run Westerly along the South line of Park Street for a distance of 160.0 feet to the point of beginning of the parcel herein described; thence run South for a distance of 140.0 feet; thence run North for a distance of 140.0 feet to the South line of Park Street; thence run East along the South line of Park Street for a distance of 140.0 feet to the point of beginning. Containing 0.45 acre, more or less, situated in the NW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 34, Township 15 North, Range 12 East, and being a part of Lot 2 of Block 6 of the Southwest Square according to the official plat of the Town of Louisville, Winston County, Mississippi.

Boundary Justification:

The acreage being nominated is the parcel presently owned by the City of Louisville and which contains only the Old Masonic Hall and gazebo.


