Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Merchants and Farmers Bank is a two-story, commercial row building on Main Street in Okolona. The first story of the facade is composed of smooth-dressed stone, while the second story is constructed of rusticated stone. A large elliptical arch supported by short pilasters with foliated capitals extends across the width of the This arch is divided into three bays by two slender, first floor. engaged Tuscan columns which support a dentilled transom bar. One of the end bays provides a sheltered angled entrance into the first level and entrance to a stairway which leads to the second level. This exterior entryway is accented by a pressed tin ceiling. The other two bays have large, operable windows which open into the original bank space on the first floor. The arched opening is trimmed with stepped voussoirs and a decorative scrolled keystone. Directly above the voussoirs is the legend "The Merchants & Farmers Bank" in carved stone.

Three large, arched, one-over-one double-hung windows are on the second level of the facade. A plain stone belt course forms the sills, and voussoirs with scrolled keystones trim the wooden windows. A parapet caps the facade.

The main space of the first floor originally served as the bank's lobby. This area is accented by a coffered pressed metal ceiling and pressed metal walls. The original wault door with pediment and pilaster frame of metal is intact.

### Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The Merchants and Farmers Bank derives its significance from its architectural character (criterion C). Its Richardsonian Romanesque features, its stone construction, and its pressed metal interior are all rare in Mississippi.

According to a listing of state banks in the files of the Mississippi Department of Archives and History, the Merchants and Farmers Bank of Okolona was one of three state banks chartered in 1897. The bank building was constructed in 1903 and is unaltered. Diminutive in scale, the building's stone facade, arched openings and squat pilasters combine to create a well-executed example of an eclectic interpretation of the Richardsonian Romanesque style, a style usually associated with churches and public buildings of a much grander scale. The Richardsonian Romanesque style never achieved widespread popularity in Mississippi, and relatively few buildings were constructed in that mode. In addition, stone construction which predates the Classical resurgence of the early twentieth century is relatively uncommon in the state.

The most notable feature of the building is its surprisingly intact interior. The main space of the first floor is significant in that not only is the original pressed tin coffered ceiling intact, but the majority of the walls are clad with pressed tin that is salvable. Interiors which have such complete surviving pressed metal surfaces are extremely rare in Mississippi.
