



ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION:

One-story gable-front brick structure with clapboarded gable ends; three-bay shed porch. Segmental-arch windows and central entrance. Three concrete slabs, measuring approximately five feet long, a foot wide, and two feet high, are situated five feet southeast of the facade.

ALTERATIONS: Cinder-block addition along rear (northwest) facade.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE:

The Old Brickyard Place is the only extant structure on the site of the Port Gibson Brick and Manufacturing Company. Other structures on the site included several one-story frame warehouse buildings. The company was founded ca. 1880 by a group of Port Gibson entrepreneurs also associated with the Port Gibson Oil Works. A Minutes Book from 1896 shows George Wheelless president, H. Goepel, vice-president, and B.H. Levy, secretary. Goepel and Wheelless were two of the five founders of the Port Gibson Oil Works in 1882. The structure is architecturally interesting in the use of varied brick courses along the windowless side elevations, and the splayed buttressbases on both corners of the facade.
