AN ORDINANCE TO CREATE THE BRANDON HISTORIC DISTRICT, AND TO ESTABLISH THE MANAGEMENT AUTHORITY OF THE SAID DISTRICT.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Alderman of the city of Brandon, Mississippi:

Section 1.

That the Brandon Historic Preservation Commission's recommendations for the boundaries of the Brandon Historic District be established as contained in the following description...

Commence at a point of beginning with the entire boundaries of the Old Brandon Cemetery located on Old Depot Road according to the official map of the Historic District of Brandon, attached reference and incorporated herein by reference; thence proceeding southeast along both sides of Old Depot Road to the intersection of Old Depot Road and Pearl Street; returning to the intersection of Old Depot Road and College Street and proceeding east along both sides of College Street to the intersection of College Street and Pearl Street; thence going south along both sides of Pearl Street to Tamberline Street; returning to the intersection of College Street and Pearl Street and proceeding south along both sides of College Street to the intersection of Tamberline Street and College Street; thence proceeding west along both sides of Tamberline Street to its end; returning to the intersection of College Street and Tamberline Street and going south along both sides of College Street to the intersection of College Street and Government Street or Highway 80 at the "red light;" thence proceeding east along both sides of Government Street to the intersection of Government Street and Poindexter Street; thence going south along both sides of Poindexter Street to the intersection of Poindexter Street and East Jasper Street; returning to the intersection of Poindexter Street and Government Street and proceeding east along Government Street to the intersection of Black Street and Government Street; thence proceeding south along both sides of Black Street to the intersection of Black Street and Dining Street; returning to the intersection of Black Street and Government Street and proceeding east along both sides of Government Street with all properties facing "the square" included to the intersection of Government Street and Timber Street; thence south along both sides of Timber Street to the intersection of Timber Street and Mary Ann Drive; returning to the intersection of Government Street and Timber Street and proceeding west on Government Street to its intersection with Mary Ann Drive; thence proceeding south along both sides of Mary Ann Drive to its intersection with Louis Wilson Drive; returning to the intersection of Mary Ann Drive and Government Street and going west to the intersection of Government Street and College Street at the "red light"; thence proceeding south along both sides of College Street to the intersection of Dining Street and College Street; thence going east on Dining Street to the intersection of Dining Street and Mary Ann Drive; returning to the intersection of Dining Street and College Street and proceeding south along both sides of College Street to the intersection of West Jasper Street and College Street; thence west along both sides of West Jasper to the intersection of West Jasper Street and Overby Street; returning to the intersection of West and East Jasper Streets and College Street and going east along both sides of East Jasper Street to the intersection of East Jasper


Street and Pleasant Street; returning to the intersection of East Jasper Street and College Street and proceeding south along both sides of College Street to the intersection of College Street and Prescott Drive; thence proceeding west along both sides of Prescott Drive to 126 Prescott Drive on the north side and 117 Prescott Drive on the south side; returning to the intersection of Prescott Drive and College Street and going south along both sides of College Street to the intersection of Highway 468 and College Street.

107 Pleasant Street and the entire site of Trillium Gardens, formerly known as Wisteria Hall, will be stand alone historic landmarks outside the boundaries of the Brandon Historic District.

And furthermore, that the said section of the City of Brandon therein described, be designated as the Brandon Historic District with two stand alone historic landmarks.

Section 2. That the Brandon Historic District and historic landmarks shall be under the management of the Brandon Historic Preservation Commission and that said district and landmarks shall be governed under the regulations of the Ordinance created by the City of Brandon for the establishment of the Brandon Historic Preservation Commission.

Section 3. That this Ordinance take effect and be in force thirty (30) days from after its passage as provided by law.
