

AN ORDINANCE BY THE MAYOR AND THE BOARD OF ALDERMAN OF THE CITY OF WINONA, MISSISSIPPI TO ESTABLISH AN HISTORIC DISTRICT

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMAN:

SECTION I. Pursuant to the authority as set out in Miss. Code Ann. §39-13-3 (1972) the governing authorities of the City of Winona, Mississippi are empowered to establish historic districts and landmarks within the corporate limits of said municipalities.

SECTION II. Upon review of the recommendations of the duly appointed Historical Preservation Commission of the City of Winona the Mayor and Board of Alderman of the City of Winona find that there should be created within the City the following described Historical District:

Commence at the Eastern most entrance on Summit Street to the Oakwood cemetery, thence easterly to the intersection of Summit and U.S Highway 51, then proceed in a northerly direction to the intersection of U.S. Highway 51 and Jones Street, proceed thence easterly down Jones Street to the intersection of Jones Street with Sterling Avenue, thence in a southerly direction to Magnolia Street, thence easterly across the Illinois Central Railroad tracks to the intersection with North Central Avenue, thence Northerly along Front Street to the intersection of Front Street and Carrollton Avenue, thence proceed westerly along Carrollton Avenue to Church Street and southerly along Church Street to Powell Street, and from said intersection back along Church Street to the intersection of Church Street and Summit Street; thence westerly along Summit Street to the Point of Beginning containing therewith all parcels adjacent to the street described hereinabove.

SECTION III. The territory described above shall be, and same hereby is, declared the Winona Historic District with the attendant rights and duties set out in that certain Ordinance adopted by this Board on the 17th day of June 2003 as set out in Ordinance Book 8, and duly recorded in Minute Book 55, at pages 7201-7216, and pursuant to the

provisions of Miss. Code Ann. §39-13-1 (1972) *et seq.*

SECTION IV. In order to promote the general welfare through the preservation and protection of historic resources and pursuant to the City of Winona Ordinance referenced hereinabove, no exterior features of any structure located within said Historic District and located adjacent to the street described therein shall be erected, altered, reconstructed, restored, rehabilitated or demolished unless and until a certificate of appropriateness has been applied for and received by the Winona Historical Commission.

SECTION V. All definitions contained in the Ordinance referenced above and duly recorded in Minute 55, pages 7201-7216 shall apply and are hereby incorporated herein.

SECTION VI. The Mayor and Board of Alderman may, from time to time and upon the recommendation of the Winona Historic Preservation Commission amend this Ordinance.

SECTION VII. The Ordinance shall become effective thirty days after its passage.

SECTION VIII. That the Clerk of the City of Winona, Mississippi be, and she is hereby directed to cause the publication of the Ordinance in a timely manner required by law and to obtain from the publisher of The Winona Times a paper which said publication is to appear, a proof if publication reflects the said publication.

The above and foregoing Ordinance, having been first reduced to writing, was read and considered section by section then as whole; the motion to adopt the foregoing Ordinance being made by Alderman Flowers, who was seconded by Alderman Shelton, the vote section by section and a whole being as follows:

1. Section I-VIII:



Alderman David Ware voted "AYE";


Thereupon, the Mayor declared the motion carried and said Ordinance adopted on this the 28th day of July 2010.




Charles L. Shelton, Alderman


