ORDINANCE DESIGNATING CENTRAL FIRE STATION LOCATED AT 201 SOUTH PRESIDENT STREET, A HISTORIC LANDMARK PURSUANT TO SECTION 15 1/2 ET SEQ JACKSON CODE OF ORDINANCES, AFTER PROVIDING FOR A HEARING AS REQUIRED BY ORDINANCE.

WHEREAS, the Historic Preservation Commission has initiated application to designate Central Fire Station, located at 201 South President Street, Jackson, Mississippi a historic landmark as authorized by ordinances of the City of Jackson and laws of the State of Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, the building constructed in 1904 as housing the first paid Firefighters of Jackson, thereby dissolving the private volunteer units; and

WHEREAS, on July 9, 1991, after review of the application and investigation of the historical or architectural or archaeological or cultural significance of Central Fire Station the Historic Preservation Commission recommended that the property met the criteria established and should therefore be designated a historical landmark within the City of Jackson; and

WHEREAS, on July 30, 1991, the City Council enacted a Resolution establishing a public hearing on September 4, 1991 at 8:30 a.m., at City Hall, to consider said application, and said Resolution was published for three (3) consecutive weeks as required by law; and

WHEREAS, after holding the public hearing, it appears to the Council that the Historic Preservation Commission's recommendation should be accepted, said application establishing that said property is culturally, socially, politically, economically or architecturally significant.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI:

SECTION 1. That the property located in the first Judicial District of Hinds County, Mississippi, more particularly described as follows:

Begin at the intersection of the west right-of-way line of South President Street and the south right-of-way line of East Pearl Street. Then run south approximately 110 feet along the west right-of-way line of South President Street to the intersection of the north line of City Hall parcel.

Then run west approximately 169 feet to the intersection of the east right-of-way line of an alley. Then run north approximately 110 feet along the east line of said alley to the intersection with the south right-of-way line of East Pascagoula Street. Then run east approximately 169 feet along the south right-of-way line of said street to the point of beginning.

is hereby designated a Landmark pursuant to Section 15 1/2 et Seq of the Jackson Code of Ordinances and the laws of the State of Mississippi.

Section 2. The Planning Director shall note such change on the official historic map and update the official list of Historic Designations of the City of Jackson, Mississippi.

Section 3. That the cost of publication of this Ordinance shall be borne by the applicant.

Section 4. That the City Clerk shall file a certified copy of this Ordinance with the Chancery Clerk of Hinds County, Mississippi. Filing fee shall be borne by the applicant.

Section 5. That this Ordinance shall be effective thirty (30) days after its passage and after publication of same.
