


ORDINANCE DESIGNATING WESTBROOK  
HOUSE/MYNELLE GARDEN LOCATED AT 4736  
CLINTON BOULEVARD A HISTORIC LANDMARK  
PURSUANT TO SECTION 15 1/2 ET SEQ JACKSON  
CODE OF ORDINANCES, AFTER PROVIDING FOR  
HEARING AS REQUIRED BY ORDINANCE.



WHEREAS, the Historic Preservation Commission has initiated or accepted application to designate the Westbrook House and Mynelle Garden located at 4736 Clinton Boulevard, Jackson, Mississippi, a historic landmark as authorized by ordinances of the City of Jackson and laws of the State of Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, Mynelle Westbrook Green Hayward's interest in arranging flowers and shrubs, ponds and paths into an elaborate garden containing her parent's fine Mediterranean - style home now belongs to and delights the citizens of Jackson, and,

WHEREAS, on September 23, 1992 after review of the application and investigation of the historical or architectural or archaeological or culture significance of the Westbrook House/Mynelle Garden, the Historic Preservation Commission recommended that the property met the criteria established and should therefore be designated a historical landmark within the City of Jackson; and

WHEREAS, on February 23, 1993 the City Council enacted a Resolution establishing a public hearing on March 30, 1993 at 10:00 A.M., at City Hall to consider said application, and said Resolution was published for three (3) consecutive weeks as required by law; and

WHEREAS, after holding the public hearing, it appears to the Council that the Historic Preservation Commission's recommendation should be accepted, said application establishing that said properties are socially and culturally significant.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL CITY OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI:

SECTION 1. That the property located in the City of Jackson, First Judicial District of Hinds County, Mississippi, more particularly described as follows:

Begin at the intersection of the north right-of-way line of Clinton Boulevard and the west right-of-way line of Colebrook Avenue; then run northerly 400 feet, northwesterly 109.95 feet, northerly 200 feet, northwesterly 400 feet, southerly 600 feet, southeasterly 30 feet, northerly 300 feet, southeasterly 120 feet, southerly 300 feet, and southeasterly 359.75 feet to the point of beginning. All in the southwest one quarter of the southeast one quarter of Section 25 T 6N R1W.

Is hereby designated a Landmark pursuant to Section 15 1/2 et Seq of the Jackson Code of Ordinances and the laws of the State of Mississippi.

SECTION 2. The Planning Director shall note such change on the official historic map and update the official list of Historic Designations of the City of Jackson, Mississippi.

SECTION 3. That the cost of publication of this Ordinance shall be borne by the applicant.
